**Saint Francis De Sales**

## Catholic Tutor Corps

The Catholic Tutor Corps (CTC) is a grass roots organization of predominantly Catholic lay people that had its beginnings thirteen years ago. CTC grew out of the understanding that many students attending inner city Catholic schools came from low income and/or ethnic minority families, resulting in many working below grade level in school. The socioeconomic conditions that many of these students faced left them at a huge disadvantage compared with many of their peers. In an effort to address this inequity the CTC began recruiting tutors from area parishes, the University of St. Thomas Law School, as well as local businesses. This work has helped hundreds of students over the years.



Representatives from the CTC will be available after all the Sunday Masses on January 29<sup>th</sup> to discuss the program and sign up volunteers.
