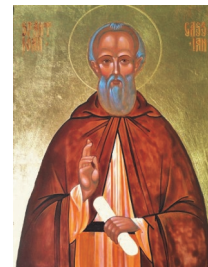

in Ordinary Time**

Saint John Cassian

St. John Cassian lived a life that was centered in both the east and the west. He was born in Romania in the 5th century. He moved to the Holy Land to live with some of the early monks. After a number of years he went to Egypt to live with the Desert Fathers and thought he would return to the Holy Land after a few months. However, he ended up staying with the Desert Fathers in Egypt for more than a decade. After many, many years in the desert, he came back to western Europe. This was an incredibly important move, the impact of which St. John Cassian probably never realized in his lifetime. Some bishops wanted him to start monasticism in the western Church. It had been primarily in the Middle East up to this point. St. John did write two works that are classics. He wrote the *Institute* and the much larger *Conferences*. The *Institute* embraces some of the earliest teaching on the deadly sins and how to battle them. The deadly sins are pride, avarice, gluttony, lust, sloth, etc. His works taught monks how to live from the lessons he learned from the Desert Fathers. Saint Benedict came along a century later and in his rule he recommended that all monks read St. John Cassian's works.
