Psalms

The Book of Psalms in the Bible includes beautiful prayers. They can be very helpful for us in our own prayers. Because they express every emotion, we can find a Psalm for just about every circumstance. St. Athanasius says “the Psalms seem to me to be like a mirror, in which the person using them can see himself, and the stirrings of his own heart; he can recite them against the background of his own emotions.”

Psalm 100 is an example of a Psalm of Thanksgiving

Psalm 63 speaks of the longing for God

Psalm 23 is well known, and speaks of the Lord being with us and bringing us to peace, walking with us even in the valley of the shadow of death

Psalm 127 speaks of the futility of relying only on ourselves

Psalm 62 assures us that we find rest in God alone

Psalm 27 tells us that we can turn to the Lord in times of fear

Psalm 131 invites the peace of humility

Psalm 91 even helps us to battle evil

Psalm 51 helps those who beg God to create a pure heart

Psalm 103 helps us understand how God removes sin from us

Not every Psalm will necessarily speak to our situation in every given moment, but at least one of them will. They teach us how to pray. This prayer can begin by acknowledging what is in our heart before God. We can do this in our own words, but at times it is difficult to find the right words. The Psalms can always be a place where we find God’s inspired Word in Scripture to express what is deepest in our hearts.
